


Park Launches 'Trip to Mars'

Close-up views of Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, and Jupiter as they revolve around the sun, and the moon as it revolves around the earth, are offered audiences at Griffith Park Observatory's planetarium theater just before their simulated rocket ship takes off on its flight for "A Trip to Mars," the current spectacular being presented at the municipal scientific center, the Los Angeles City Recreation and Park Department reported yesterday.

A model of part of the solar system is reproduced on the facility's 75-foot domed ceiling and armchair astronomers view the sky as seen from the earth and observe how the planets appear to move against the background of the stars, according to Dr. Clarence H. Clemenshaw, the observatory's director.

On the journey to Mars, space travelers watch the planet grow larger and larger before making a landing which is made realistic by the reproduction on the planetarium theater's ceiling of paintings of Mars' surface by world-famous artist Chesley Bonestell.

"A Trip to Mars" will be offered through Sept. 5, at 3, 8, and 9:15 p.m. daily with extra shows slated at 1:30 and 4:30 p.m. Saturdays, Sundays, and Labor Day. Tours of the facility's Hall of Science are open to the public without charge daily from 2 to 10 p.m., and nominal fees of 60 cents for adults and 30 cents for students under 18 years of age are in effect for planetarium theater shows.
