Shriners Slate 'Double Duty' Charity Game

At least \$30,000 in "Double Duty Dough" has been put to work in behalf of Southern California youth by members of area Shrine Clubs, it was disclosed today by Elmer P. Bromley, Managing Director of the Shrine Pageant and All-Star Football Game, to be held Aug. 5 in the Coliseum.

This double mileage money is a special fund contributed by Shrine Club members for the Shrine's youth program.

The initial contribution represents money that will be used to support operation of the Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children, sole beneficiary of all net proceeds from the annual Coliseum show and game.

In return for these direct contributions for the crippled children, a commensurate number of seats are all located to permit youth groups from throughout Southern California to attend the Coliseum program.

As of today, it was announced, some 20,000 of these free youth seats provided by the Shriners' "Double Duty Dough" have been distributed.

County Improves Local Roadways

Palos Verdes Project

Improvement of Silver Spur Road from Willow Wood Road to Basswood Avenue was ordered to start immediately by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace today.

The work will consist of widening the pavement to provide an additional traffic lane. Chace pointed out that the improvement of this traffic artery from Hawthorne to Crenshaw Blvds. was recently completed.

Chace said completion of this project will increase the traffic capacity on this segment of this major county highway which is a connecting arterial between Palos Verdes Dr. North and Crenshaw Blvd.

Indian Peak Road

Plans and specifications for the improvement of approximately one-half mile of Indian Peak Road in the Palos Verdes area were approved today by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Simultaneously the Board of Supervisors called for bids on the project which calls for construction of the roadway from Crenshaw Blvd. a half-mile westerly. Bids will be opened on Aug. 16.

The project was designed by the Los Angeles County Road Department and is scheduled to be completed in October.

The work will consist of constructing pavement for a four-lane highway within an 80-foot right-of-way. The grading and drainage structures were built by adjacent developers.

Chace pointed out that the section of Indian Peak Road extending this project westerly to Hawthorne Blvd. has already been completed. He added that completion of this project will provide better access from Crenshaw to Hawthorne Blvd. and increase traffic circulation in the southern peninsula area.
