Special Passenger Expected at Disneyland

The ten millionth passenger on the Santa Fe & Disneyland Railroad at Disneyland is expected to pass through the turnstiles of the Main Street Station Sunday.

The event will be marked by a special program headed by Walt Disney. He and R. G. Rydin, executive vice president of Santa Fe, Chicago, will make the lucky visitor an honorary vice president of the S.F. & D. Disney will also present the ten millionth rider with an elaborate OH scale model electric train layout by Rovell.

U. S. Steel Firm Reveals Earnings

Reporting the earnings of United State Steel Corporation for the second quarter of 1960, Roger M. Blough, chairman, announced that directors had today declared the quarterly dividend of \$1.75 per share on the preferred stock, payable Aug. 20, 1960, to stockholders of record at close of business on Aug. 2, 1960, and a dividend of \$7.75 per share on the common stock, payable Sept. 10, 1960, to stockholders of record at close of business on Aug. 5, 1960.

Income for the second quarter of 1960 is reported as \$80.9 million, or a return of 8.1 per cent on sales of \$1,002.4 million. Income for the first six months of 1960 is reported as \$193.5 million, or a return of 8.8 per cent on sales, which compares with income of \$254.9 million, or a return of 10.1 per cent on sales, reported for the first six months of 1959.

In the second quarter and in the first six months of 1960 employment costs include provision for current service and past service pension costs on the same basis as reported in the similar periods of 1959.

Shipments of steel products in the second quarter of 1960 amounted to 5,065,289 net tons. Shipments for the first six months totaled 11,549,881 net tons, which compares with 13,504,853 net tons shipped during the first six months of 1959.

Production of steel ingots and castings in the second quarter of 1960, amounting to 7,169,520 net tons, was equivalent to an index of 103.2 in terms of the 1947-1949 average production as

one hundred and to an average rate of 68.6 per cent of capacity. Production in the first quarter of 1960 was equivalent to an index of 141.5.

Expenditures for additions to and replacements of facilities totaled \$123 million for the second quarter of 1960. At June 30, 1960, authorized projects to be completed required a further expenditure of \$675 million.

Working capital of the Corporation and its subsidiaries at June 30, 1960, after deducting the current dividend declarations and the amount of \$495 million previously set aside for payment of property expenditures, was \$605.6 million compared with \$796.5 million at June 30, 1959.

Long-term debt at June 30, 1960, exclusive of amounts due within one year, was \$454.1 million, compared with \$485.9 million at June 30, 1959.

Two dog training classes at Walteria Park are slated to begin this week under auspices of the South Bay Obedience Club and the Torrance Recreation Department.

A class for children from 10 to 14 years of age is planned for 10 a.m. Saturdays from July 30 to Sept. 10. Dogs must be six months of age or older.

Each child must be accompanied by an adult member of his family and the dog must be properly licensed, inoculated and leashed. There is a 50-cent registration fee.

A novice class begins Tuesday at 7:30 p.m.

Both classes will be taught by Roy Smith.

The July meeting of the Harbor Aquarium Society will be held tonight at 8 p.m. in the recreation hall at McMasters Park, 174th and Yukon in Torrance. The meeting will be called to order by President Russell Gammel.

Speaker of the evening will be member Alvin McEwen of Harbor City, who will give a talk on the setting-up and maintenance of the home aquarium for the beginner. McEwen is a long-time hobbyist.

The show fish of the month will be the family of Cichlids, which includes the Angel fish, Mouthbreeders, Jewel-fish, Parrot, Firemouths and others. The door prize will be a five gallon aquarium and hood. Refreshments will be served after the meeting which is open to the public.

Society Starts Drive to Combat Ulcers

Eighteen million ulcer sufferers in the U.S. will be the eventual gainers, it is hoped, of a new research and educational program aimed for by the Ulcer Society, a non-profit organization recently formed.

Purpose of the organization, as stated by its president, Dr. C. A. Montague, is as follows: "The Ulcer Society will endeavor to enlist nationwide moral support, among ulcer patients and within the medical and pharmaceutical profession, for an immediate 'crash program' of research to discover remedial treatment for this plague of modern life." Dr. Montague quoted statistics from the United States Health Service to the effect that last year physicians diagnosed some 18 million cases of duodenal, peptic, or gastric ulcers.
