

Residents to Vote On 15 Propositions

Nov. 8, Torrance residents will trek to the polls to vote on 15 propositions, which are proposed law and amendments to the State Constitution.

First on the ballot as proposition number one will be the act providing for a bond issue of \$1,750,000,000 to be used by the Department of Water Resources for development of the water resources of the state.

Proposition two would increase to four years the terms of members of the Assembly elected in 1960 or thereafter.

The third proposition would permit totally disabled veterans entitled to a \$5,000 property tax exemption to transfer it to a subsequently acquired home.

Proposition four permits the Legislature to provide terms of office not to exceed eight years for members of any state agency created by it to administer the State College System of California.

Proposition five would increase the salary of State Legislators to \$750 per month.

Proposition six establishes the manner in which non-profit golf courses should be assessed for purposes of taxation.

Proposition seven, relating to the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners, would permit two, rather than one, board members from the same chiropractic school or college to serve on the board at the same time.

Proposition eight would permit a person convicted of a felony, other than treason or the misappropriation of public funds, to vote in elections after paying the penalties prescribed by law for his offense.

Proposition nine pertains to procedures governing

claims against chartered counties and cities.

Proposition 10 provides procedures for the removal of judges for misconduct, or to compel retirement for disability.

Proposition 11 would restrict veterans' tax exemptions to those veterans who were residents of the State at the time of entering the Armed Forces, or who are residents on Nov. 8, 1960.

Proposition 12 would eliminate certain obsolete and superseded provisions of the State Constitution.

Proposition 13 relates to the jurisdiction of District Courts of Appeal.

Proposition 14 would permit the use of Street and Highway Funds for local grade-crossing bonds.

Finally, proposition 15 would reapportion the State Senate to give 20 Senators to the north and 20 to the south, on a line formed by the northern and western boundaries of San Luis Obispo, Kern, Tulare, Inyo and Mono Counties.
