### First Baptist Church Celebrates Homecoming

The First Baptist Church of Lomita, located at Hillcrest and Western is observing a Homecoming and Open House, today. Dedication for the new Educational Building will be at 2:30 p.m. at which time hostesses will be assigned to each department to conduct a tour of the new building for guests and visitors. This building is 48 by 80 feet, two stories high, and constructed of frame stucco. The building has open stairways resembling a modern motel. It is situated directly behind the present sanctuary adjacent to Hillcrest but fronting Western Ave., where the congregation plans in the near future, to construct a new sanctuary that will seat 800. The building consists of 20 Sunday School rooms, six department assemblies, four tiled rest rooms, two large beginner departments that will care for the kindergarten and first grade children, church library, and office for the educational director. Following a Potluck Fellowship Lunch, the afternoon program will include the dedication of the building and recognition of charter members, former members and guests. A "singspiration" will follow the dedication service. Quartets, trios, duets, with special musical arrangements, will entertain in the main auditorium. Monday evening through the following Sunday, Peter McLeod, the Dynamic Youth Evangelist from Scotland, will be speaking for a Revival Crusade. The services are open to the public and will be held at 7:30 nightly. A nursery will be available for small children.
