70,000 to See Rams' Annual Pro Game

Football diehards of Torrance are awaiting the year's top pre-season football game tomorrow night at the Coliseum when the Los Angeles Rams and Washington Redskins renew their bitter rivalry.

Although the Rams didn't measure up to expectations last Saturday night, when Van Brocklin and the Eagles trounced them 20-7, the local club is a 5 point choice to knock off the Redskins. A gate of 70,000 is expected.

Over the years the Rams-Redskin donnybrooks have furnished some of the year's biggest thrills and spills and this year's edition of their annual classic figures to be another of those typically rough "wars."

In the Washington Redskins the Rams face a club that many are predicting will pick up all the marbles in the Eastern Division of the National Football League. In quarterback Eagle Day and Ralph Guglielmi the 'skins possess two of the youngest potential greats in that position.

Over the years the Rams have emerged victoriously 8 times while the Redskins have been able to dump the Rams 6; however, in the past five games, the Redskins have beaten the Rams 3 out of 5. Last year Washington registered a thrilling last second 23 to 21 verdict thanks to a perfect field goal and the brilliant running of half-back Dick James.

Los Angeles this year will counter with new plays and a couple country fair "pitchers" of their own. As of this writing coach Waterfield has not named his starting field general. It will in all probability be a close battle between veteran Billy Wade

and comparative newcomer Frank Ryan as to who will get the starting nod.

Plenty of good seats are still available with the Ram's "Kid's Plan" in force—one adult General Admission entitles the purchaser to bring along five lucky youngsters for a great night of pro football.

So, on Aug. 19 Ram fans will have another look at Bob Waterfield's "Black Watch" and can draw their own conclusions as to what kind of a season Ram diehards can look forward to.
