International travel by Californians during the first half of this year increased 11 percent as compared with the first half of 1959, the Automobile Club of Southern California announced today. Nationally, the issuance of passports by the State Department was up 21 percent to 559,502 from January through June.

The hours are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Thursdays; 10 a.m. to 8:30 p.m., Fridays; and 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Saturdays. The pricing committee works each Tuesday at the shop. This group includes: Mmes. Daryl Vaughn and Marion Young, co-chairmen assisted by Mrs. Clyde Eccles and Misses Catherine Lockett, Inez Smith and Frances Clark.


