College Offers Fire Fighting Science Course

The fire science curriculum at Harbor College, developed and taught by working firemen, has been praised by the San Diego County Fire Chiefs Association and the San Diego County Fire Training Advisory Committee, according to word received today by Captains Lawrence W. Erven and Eugene Mahoney of the Wilmington and Terminal Island Fire Stations. The San Diego groups drew upon the materials and experience of the Harbor program in setting up new curricula in fire science at Palomar College and San Diego College.

In addition, Fire Chiefs Robert Ely, Ward Ensley, Bill Elder, and James Fox, all of San Diego County, and Kenneth W. Fawcett, coordinator of trade and technical education at San Diego College, made personal visits to the Harbor campus before beginning the fire science training program in their own county. The idea of the Harbor College program began early in 1955, when two citizens of the Harbor Area, Captains Erven and Mahoney, decided that individual study of fire department instructional materials was slow going. It seemed to them that firemen would learn more quickly and enjoyably if they could study in groups under competent instructors rather than alone and unaided.

The two men therefore developed a plan for fire science courses which would be practical and comprehensive, and meet the needs of firemen, career-minded young men, and men in industry who are concerned with fire hazards and problems. The curriculum includes subjects ranging from Laws, Codes, and Ordinances to Fire Fighting and Rescue Practices. It presents laboratory demonstrations of hazardous materials. It teaches maintenance and operation of all types of fire apparatus. It has been expanded to include subjects including math and speed reading.

Dudley Named to Nat'l. Supply Post

Kenneth W. Dudley has been appointed chief engineer at the Torrance plant of The National Supply Company. He succeeds Forrest J. Young, who retired after 43 years service at the plant. Mr. Dudley started with the company as a draftsman in 1941 and after service in World War II returned to the plant. Following his graduation from the University of Southern California in 1948, he was appointed a design engineer. He has been a project engineer since 1949.

Distance Information Available by Dialing

Pacific Telephone subscribers with Direct Distance Dialing (DDD) in the Torrance exchange now can get telephone number information direct from operators in distant cities, according to R. J. Pyle, manager. Initially, information operators in New York City, Baltimore, Chicago, Detroit, Indianapolis, Pittsburgh, Pa., and the state of Delaware will provide telephone numbers to distant callers. The plan eventually will cover the nation.

The manager pointed out that the service will work this way: An L.A. caller wishes to get the number of a subscriber in New York City. He dials the area code for New York City (212) followed by the numerals 555-1212. The entire number dialed is 212-555-1212.

The information operator in New York City answers and attempts to provide the number requested. There is no charge for this service.

"The long distance information number '555-1212' will be a universally-used information number for subscribers who have DDD," the manager pointed out. "It will always be preceded by the area code number."

The new service, the manager said, is in line with the overall DDD concept of subscribers dialing their own calls direct to distant points.
