### Gov. Brown Coming Here for Prop. 1

The Citizens Committee, comprising volunteers from 12 cities in the area, will work with the inter-city mayors and city councilmen in sponsoring the event.

Serving on the dinner committee honoring Gov. Brown are Perry Walker, Hermosa Beach mayor, and president, League of California Cities, Mayor Albert Isen, Torrance, and Mayor Leroy Center, Redondo Beach. Torrance City Councilman J. A. Beasley has been named temporary chairman.

Tickets for the dinner, \$5 per person, will be allotted on a population basis, a spokesman for the group announced. The proposed water bill, which will allot an estimated \$1,750,000,000 over a 15 year period to bring water from the north to Southern California, has been endorsed by the Torrance Chamber of Commerce.

Gov. Brown is expected to discuss all aspects of the controversial water bill at the dinner meeting here.

The Harbor Area YW, under leadership of Mrs. Elsa Morris, announced the entire matter is a "legal one." "As soon as we can work out the legal technicalities, the Torrance girls can get their lease," she said. The Council ordered the city attorney to expedite the matter.
