Waterfowl Area Opening Slated

Opening dates of State and Federal waterfowl management areas were announced jointly today by Walter T. Shannon, Director of the California Department of Fish and Game, and Leo Laythe, Regional Director of the U.S. Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. Four of the areas will be open Oct. 15, the first day of the statewide duck season. Two others will follow a week later and four others a week after that. Here is a list of the areas they will be open to public and the dates upon which hunting: Honey Lake Waterfowl Management Area, Oct. 15; Grizzly Island Waterfowl Management Area, Oct. 15; Imperial Waterfowl Management Area, Oct. 15; and San Luis Wasteway, Oct. 15. Los Banos Waterfowl Management Area, Oct. 22; Mendota Waterfowl Management Area, Oct. 22; Merced National Wildlife Management Area, Oct. 29; Colusa National Wildlife Refuge, Oct. 29; Sutter National Wildlife Refuge, Oct. 29; and Gray Lodge Waterfowl Management Area, Oct. 29. Shoot days on all of the areas will be Saturdays, Sun-

days, and Wednesdays and Veterans Day, Nov. 11 during the first half of the 1960-61 season. Applications for reservations on shoot days at any of the areas must be received by the Department of Fish and Game, 722 Capitol Ave., Sacramento, at least 10 days before the first shooting day requested. Applications are now available throughout the state from any Fish and Game license agent.


