

Harbor College Heads to Attend Annual Conclave

Twenty Harbor College administrators and faculty members will be among the 1500 educators attending the annual fall conference of the Southern California Junior College Association at Santa Monica City College, Saturday, Oct. 15.

Harbor College President Wendell C. Black, as association president, will preside at the meeting.

The theme of the Santa Monica meeting, "A Citizen Looks at Education," will be introduced to the conference by the keynote speaker, Dr. William V. Lawlor, practicing dentist, currently chairman of the Citizen's Advisory Committee on Education.

After the general session, 30 subject area groups will meet to discuss aspects of the junior college program, ranging from administrative problems to academic achievement.

Tilley, a former Eagle Scout, has served in Scouting Leadership in Wyoming and Hawaii. Since 1959 he has been Harbor District Training Instructor.

Tilley will be responsible for the opening and closing ceremonies at the Nov. 9 banquet as well as assured the proper setting for the presentation of awards.



Multi-Million New Marine City Plans Announced

Creation of a new multi-million dollar planned marine city for Southern California was announced here today by Lewis W. Douglas Jr., president of Christiana Oil Corporation.

The residential marina, "Huntington Harbour" will include 1,500 waterfront home sites, multiple family units, recreational areas, shopping centers, a yacht club, and ample mooring facilities, within 45 minutes from downtown Los Angeles. Development will begin immediately.

Huntington Harbour Corporation, a subsidiary of Christiana Oil, purchased the 820-acre property, formerly called Rancho Lomita, for \$3.4 million. Sale was recorded Oct. 10.

Huntington Harbour's location is adjacent to the ocean between Seal Beach and Huntington Beach.

Moffatt and Nichol, Long Beach, have been retained as consulting engineers. An estimated \$1000 million is involved in the overall development including marine improvements, installation of utilities, residential and commercial building.


