Busy Days Are Freezer Dinner Enjoyable Ones

It is more fun to gad-about all day or do some cleaning jobs that have been put off, if dinner is no problem. Especially if a meal-in-a-casserole is waiting in the

freezer and just has to be popped into the oven as it is, needing only a salad and a simple dessert to complete the menu.

Such a dinner might be a baked lasagne, accompanied by a green salad in a sparkling crystal bowl, crusty bread and, for dessert, ice cream with fruit preserves for a topping. The lasagne couldn't be easier: for the sauce, you combine canned tomato sauce with instant minced onion, olive oil and herbs—no cooking needed. This is placed in layers in a cold casserole with the cooked lasagne noodles (or large flat macaroni, if you can't find lasagne in your local market), and slices of mozzarella cheese. Cover the glass casserole, slip it into the freezer, and there it waits until the evening you're ready for it.

Another frozen casserole dinner might be beef stew, accompanied by hot rolls, cel-

ery and olives in place of salad, for dessert a cheesecake (Pick up the cheesecake and the rolls at the bakery on the way home). Or make a casserole of shrimp creole, with rice—this needs only a simple salad, perhaps watercress and sliced eggs, hot oven-ready rolls or biscuits and a fruit dessert such as melon balls topped with scoops of sherbet. And because your glass casseroles are easy to wash, "clean-up" time will be cut in half.

QUICK AND EASY BAKED LASAGNE
1/2 pound lasagne noodles
2 cans family-size (15-oz.) tomato sauce
1 6-ounce can sliced mushrooms
1/4 cup olive oil
2 tablespoons instant minced onion
1/4 teaspoon oregano
1 8-ounce package mozzarella cheese
Cook lasagne in boiling salted water until tender (a little olive oil added to water will prevent noodles from sticking together); drain. Combine tomato sauce, mushrooms with their liquid, onion, oil and oregano, blending well. Pour a little sauce over bottom of 2-quart casserole. Add layer of lasagne, more sauce, layer of thinly-sliced cheese, and so on until dish is full, with cheese and sauce on top. Place cover on casserole; store in freezer. When ready to use, remove from freezer to room temperature, place in cold oven set at 350 degrees and bake for 35 minutes until cheese is melted and golden and sauce bubbling. Makes 6 to 8 servings.
