Before a jam-packed crowd of 5000 at Seahawk Stadium in Redondo Beach Friday night, the Spartans from South Torrance bowed to a 'Hawk eleven in a thriller, 26-19.

Defeated by Hawthorne 13-0 last week, South High attempted in vain to notch their first Bay League victory and stay in contention for the top spot. Redondo had other ideas. With this win the Hawks are now tied for first place.

South drew the first score on the board early in the first quarter. On a sustained drive to the Seahawk's 14 yard line, Austin then rolled out and pitched to Mike Andrews for the touchdown. The conversion was good and South led 7-0. The 7-point margin did not last long as Ronnie Seratto went over for a Redondo touchdown from 11 yards out after South had punted short to their own 40 yard line. The attempt for the point was missed and at the end of the initial frame South still managed to hold onto a 7-6 edge.

The scoring was reversed, however, in the second quarter. South got the six and Redondo the seven and at the end of the first half the Bay League game was at a standstill, 13-13. The fleet-footed Serrato went 77 yards for the 'Hawk tally and Davis pitched to Phil Fish for 16 yards and a Spartan score.

In the third stanza Redondo took command and scored two touchdowns to best the South High gridders 26-13. Jim Allison went nine yards through tackle for the first and Fowler threw to Stan Shult for what proved to be the winning touchdown. The latter was accomplished with a fourth and seven situation on the South 14 yard marker.

On a long drive that carried to the Redondo two foot line, Bob Wehrhan drove through center for South's last touchdown.


Leuzinger might have been playing in the wrong league as a mighty Mira Costa eleven dismayed the home crowd Friday night by blasting Leuzinger 25-0.

GUNTER AND TORTORELLI VIE FOR POINT IN NOVICE MOTORCYCLE RIDERS' BATTLE

Both expert and novice motorcycle riders are in the tightest point battle in many years as the season moves into its final stages Friday night at Ascot Stadium.

The fur really will fly as Al Gunter and Don Tortorelli try to withstand the determined challenge of the best field of the year assembled by J. C. Agajanian. Winners automatically become National dirt track champions of 1960.

Gunter, point leader in the expert division, will be threatened by a half dozen hot shoes, including the wild

riding Bart Markel, recent winner of the Midwest half mile dirt track championship. Also holder of the new National TT title, Markel definitely will compete, according to Agajanian. Markel developed a large following when he captured the first two of three main events held early this season at Ascot. He then left for a triumphant tour of the Midwest, but is back to battle Gunter; Sammy "The Flying Flea" Tanner, 1958 and '59 dirt track champ; Stu Morley winner of four previous mains; and Dick Dorresteyn, 1959 state king.

Agajanian predicts that the race for points in the novice class may well overshadow the battle among the experts. Don Tortorelli leads by a margin so narrow that any one of four other riders who have a good night can jump into the lead. Many think Elliott Schultz, returning after recovering from injuries, will give the leaders the most trouble. But you can't discount Jim Plain, '60 state champ; Mil Green, fastest improving rider; and Jim Dove.

Racing begins at 8:30 p.m. and 14 events will be presented.
