for a new tax election next spring.

Slated for additional discussion will be possible appointment for a committee to study the district's financial situation and to make recommendations to the Board of Education, a school board spokesman announced.

"We apparently will be about \$1,000,000 short for next year's budget," Board President William C. Boswell, announced.

"This is a matter of extreme urgency. We probably should have a new election as soon as possible," he added.

Dr. J. Hull announced a 75 cent proposal might be considered next time, since the "50 cent tax might become obsolete within a year or so."

"It now appears some action may be taken within the next two or three years to help the school district's financial situation," Hull said. "The best thing might be to propose a 75 cent override tax for 3 years," he added.

School officials also indicated that by adding one elementary pupil to each teacher's class next year, a saving of \$102,000 might be made; and by adding one high school student to each class, another saving of \$56,000 might be realized.

"There are legal technicalities to work out before we see a commercial strip on the edge of the airport, but a master plan setting forth policy is important," Egan said.

The Torrance airport covers some 400 acres, with 5000 feet fronting the Pacific Coast Highway, and 2500 feet facing Madison on the West boundary.
