The World Freedom Bell, a gift of the American people to the people of West Berlin, will celebrate its tenth anniversary tomorrow Oct. 24.

The Freedom Bell is the symbol of the Radio Free Europe, Crusade for Freedom. A private, non-profit network, RFE broadcasts to five communist-dominated countries, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Romania and Bulgaria. This year, during a tour sponsored by the Radio Free Europe Fund, 60 prominent Americans will rededicate the bell. West Berlin Mayor Willy Brandt will preside as host of the event.

Smog Comments

A thoughtful comment on the smog condition in the Los Angeles County area was made recently by Lewis P. Crutcher, assistant professor of architecture, at the University of Oregon.
