Edison Company Launches Plan to Give Scholarships

The second year of Southern California Edison Company's College Scholarship Program for high school seniors will get under way this week, according to G. L. Blanchard, Edison district manager.

Brochures describing the Edison scholarship plan have been distributed to high schools throughout the area, Blanchard said.

Edison is offering 10 four-year scholarships for the academic year 1961-62. Winning students will receive \$500 annually toward tuition and expenses. The colleges or universities they select will be presented direct grants from Edison of \$750 annually, he explained.


