**McLean Leads Tartars With 368 yds. Rushing**

Leading the Torrance Tartar Varsity tomorrow night on the ground against Aviation will be Jerry McLean a Junior halfback for the title bound Tartars.

Jerry has been the locals number one ball carrier since the opening game of the season, he has scored four touchdowns and has gained 368 yards rushing in four games, for an average of 8 yards per carry to become one of the


Junior backs in Tartar history.

McLean started out his football career at Torrance High, by playing first string quarterback on the B squad in his Freshman year, last year he moved up to the varsity and lettered by playing mostly in the Tartar defensive backfield.

Besides being a football star, Jerry also maintains a B average in the class-

rooms and is on the 1960 student council as Junior class president.

**Bruins Play Host to Wolfpack**

A couple of powerful once-beaten football teams, North Carolina State's Wolfpack and UCLA's Bruins, figure to wage a tremendous inter-sectional battle at the Los Angeles Coliseum this Saturday night (Oct. 29). Kickoff time is 8:15 p.m.

Earle Edwards' snarling Wolfpack comes to town with a solid 5-1-0 record, including a 20-13 victory over previously undefeated Mississippi Southern last week. This is a marked improvement over last season when this Atlantic Coast Conference power limped into the Coliseum with a dismal 1-6-0 mark before losing to the Bruins, 21-12, in their first meeting.

Bill Barnes' battling Bruins also boast a more solid record now than they did when they faced the 1959 Wolfpack UCLA posted a convincing 26-8 victory over Stanford last week to bring its season mark to 2-1-1. Last year, the Bruins went into the North Carolina State game with a losing 2-3-1 mark.

Leading the Wolfpack into action is probably the best all-round T-quarterback in the past decade. He's Roman Gabriel, a 6-4, 200-lb. junior who not only can murder you with his passing but also can kill you with his quarterback sneaks and roll outs.

The sensational Mr. Gabriel has had a hand in 10 of the last 11 Wolfpack touchdowns. Last week against Mississippi Southern he passed for two tallies, ran for the other and passed for a two-point conversion to account for all of his team's points.

He was again this week named on UPI's "Backfield of the week" for the second time this season and three times has been named "Player of the Week" in the Atlantic Coast Conference. He's the ACC total offense leader with 797 yards, to date, with 692 yards by passing (69 of 102 for a .578 percentage and six TDs.) and 105 yards by rushing on 55 carries for four tallies.
