Int'l House of Pancakes to Open Soon

The Torrance unit of the International House of Pancakes will be opened in the first week of Dec., in the Del Amo Shopping Center adjacent to the Broadway Dept. Store, it was announced today by Al Lpin Jr., president of the organization.

The International House of Pancakes is one of the more phenomenal success stories of the restaurant business today. It officially came into being July 7, 1958 when the first unit was opened in the Toluca Lake district of Burbank-North Hollywood, California. It was an immediate success, consistently serving more than 35,000 patrons each month from the day the doors first opened.

The success of the Toluca Lake restaurant, prompted the opening of two more units in 1959. The second is in the Crenshaw shopping area, Los Angeles, Calif.; the third is in Panorama City, Calif.

A commissary was opened in November of 1959 to service the fast growing chain's restaurant. It houses the main office, ware house, freezer and refrigeration facilities, processing kitchen and mixing plant. "Quality-Control" is rigidly adhered to at the commissary, as in the restaurants. No product is used at any International House of Pancakes being tested and approved by the Commissary test laboratory and kitchen. All batter mixes are prepared at the Commissary according to a carefully guarded series of secret formulas and then shipped to the various restaurants thus insuring patrons of the same high quality food at each unit.

The first franchised International House of Pancakes was opened in Woodland Hills, Calif. In July, 1960. Shortly thereafter, one was opened in Louisville, Kentucky. October 17 marked the opening of one in Northridge, Calif.

As of Oct. 24, 1960, less than three years since the first one was opened, there are six International Houses of Pancakes in operation. In addition, ones are in various stages of construction in Culver City, the Del Amo Shopping Center, Inglewood, Hollywood, La Mirada, Whittier, Glendale, Montebello, Joliet, Illinois, and Fort Wayne, Indiana. Land has been acquired and construction will begin in the near future in Miami, Florida, Phoenix, Arizona, Pasadena, Hidden Hills, 154th and Crenshaw in Los Angeles, and

Lane Rules

Choice of lane depends on speed. The law provides that any vehicle proceeding at a speed less than the normal speed of traffic shall be driven in the right-hand lane or as close as practicable to the right-hand edge of the roadway.

On a multiple lane highway, with two or more lanes of traffic moving each way, this normally means that drivers should stay in the right-hand lane unless passing or preparing to make a left turn. This leaves the left-hand lane or lanes clear for passing.

The International House of Pancakes is a corporation consisting of six stockholders and an eight-man board of directors. The stock is totally owned but the corporation is contemplating an intra-state public stock issue in the near future.

Apart from franchise grants, the only possibility of investment with the organization, currently, is in the land investment program, which provides a guaranteed net of 10% of monies invested against 5% of the gross volume. None of the existing restaurants have ever failed in exceeding the minimum guarantee.

President of the company is Al Lpin, Jr. He attended SC and UCLA. He was employed by the federal government and saw service in the Army Signal Corps. In 1950 he and his brother Jerry purchased Coffee Time, a coffee despening service, for \$3,250. Seven years later they sold Coffee Time for an amount in excess
