The first book drive was held in 1956. More than 800 books were donated, many of which were not usable. After months of cataloging, separating, and repairs, the library opened with approximately 400 books on hand, in September, 1957. Due to the limited space and help, it was open to students every other week only.

There are now more than 1000 books in the collection and students are able to visit it once a week. Each student may select one book and in the event that he forgets his book, the next week five cents is charged, and for each week overdue. A reason-

able amount is also charged for damaged or lost books. With these funds new books and supplies are bought. The library is used by teachers and students alike from the first grade up.




