80,000 TB CASES

Almost 80,000 new TB cases reported in the United States last year, California had a total of 5320 with 814 deaths. In Los Angeles county 281 died from TB, 173 of whom were Los Angeles city residents. The county reported 2084 new cases—1190 in the city of Los Angeles.

Gunshot Victim Resting Quietly In Area Hospital

A Redondo woman was resting quietly in a local hospital this morning after her estranged husband shot her three times as she fled in terror. He then turned the gun on himself.

Investigating officers reported that the woman, Mae Jean Triggs, 50, was still listed as critical on hospital rolls.

Body of the husband, Willard Earl Triggs, 51 a baker was found in a locked room with a 22 caliber revolver lying on the floor nearby. Eight shots had been fired from the pistol and police summarized that the distraught man had fired seven shots at his fleeing wife and the eighth into his own head.

Mrs. Triggs left her husband three weeks ago and had met with him briefly Sunday before the shooting.

Neighbors told police Triggs began shooting when the woman left the house, ignoring his shouts for her to return.

Huge Dividend Is Distributed To County, City

The State Board of Equalization this week received congratulations from Governor Edmund G. Brown for administrative economy that resulted in \$354,786 dividends being returned to the cities and counties of California.

Richard Nevins, Fourth District Board Member, explained that this is in addition of the one per cent local sales and use tax during the past fiscal year. The current payment is the difference between administrative costs originally estimated at 1.64 per cent and the actual costs of only 1.50 per cent of the revenue.

Governor Brown told Nevins: "I am particularly proud that your economy has been achieved without any sacrifice of good administration. The State Board of Equalization audit program is second to none in the 36 states which have general sales taxes."

A mobile chest X-ray unit of the Los Angeles school system was on the Harbor College campus for the first three days of this week to provide free service to students and school personnel, college Health coordinator Jean McAlary reported.

Approximately 2000 persons availed themselves of the X-ray service, purpose of which is to locate diseases of the chest, including heart disease and tuberculosis, and to educate people to understand the importance of an annual X-ray.

"An X-ray takes only three minutes and, of course, you don't even feel it," Mrs. McAlary explained. "Getting an X-ray checked every year is one of the best ways to look

alive, feel alive and stay alive."
