Funeral services were conducted Wednesday, November 3, at Church of the Recessional, Forest Lawn Memorial Park for Joseph H. Moore, 56, well-known aircraft executive who died in his home Saturday, November 26.

Associated with the aircraft industry since 1927, Mr. Moore was a founder and until his death, vice president-manufacturing of Horkey-Moore Associates, a division of Houston Fearless Corporation. He started his career in aviation at Lockheed Aircraft Co., predecessor firm to Lockheed Aircraft Corp. He was subsequently employed by the latter firm, and later, at Douglas Aircraft Co., Inc.

Mr. Moore leaves his widow, Kathryn, Los Angeles; a son, Joseph H., Jr., and a daughter, Jean Ann. He is also survived by his mother, Mrs. Arlie Moore.
