


'Ocean View Living' Among Stellar Attractions of Vista Del Mar Estates

"Ocean view" living is one of the stellar attractions of the luxuriously appointed one and two-story residences introduced at the current pre-opening of Vista del Mar Estates in the Palos Verdes Hills, according to Paul D. Robinson, sales agent.

Careful planning has oriented the spacious homes on the rolling terrain to capture magnificent, panoramic views of the ever-changing Pacific ocean. And to heighten their charm, extremely effective use of huge window walls and sliding glass walls has been made, Robinson said.

Focal point of much of the visitor and buyer interest are the striking two-story residences. As example, Plan 2 is typical of these exciting new residences.

Actually a "split-level" design with the one story structure away from the sea, the upper level houses the living room, dining room, master bedroom suite and the appliance-equipped kitchen. Sliding glass doors from both the dining room and the living room open onto a spacious breeze-swept sun deck with magnificent sea view.

There are two spacious bedrooms, a huge "rumpus room" with a second fireplace (fireplace no. 1 is in the upstairs living room), a second bath and a special laundry area.

Handsome exterior stylings include a variety of Provencal, Conventional and contemporary as well as charming exteriors with Hawaiian motifs. One story plans offer three bedrooms, three bedrooms with family room or two bedrooms with den, all with two baths.

Complete with their many luxury and convenience features, the one-story residences are fully priced from \$24,500 to \$27,500 and the two-story homes are from \$30,000 to \$32,000. Robinson explained, with FHA, Cal-Vet and conventional financing available.

All plans in these new James N. Starbird & Company homes feature fireplaces in traditional or corner designs, hardwood parquet floors, forced air heating with thermostat, kitchens with built-in wall oven and range in choice of gas or electric, pass-throughs and snack bars and separate service porches.

Two-story models have two fireplaces, a convenient laundry center on the lower level and a big sun-deck with flood lighting for night entertaining.

To reach Vista del Mar Estates, drive out Western Ave. to 25th St. in Palos Verdes Hills. Turn right on 25th St. and follow Marineland signs to Anchoy Ave. Models are at 25th St. and Anchoy Ave. in Palos Verdes Hills.

Atomic Energy Commission Official To Head El Camino College Study

Radiation and radioisotopes will be two of the special topics under discussion at the "Education in the Nuclear Sciences" conferences to be held at El Camino College Tuesday, January 24, in the Campus Theatre.

Scheduled from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. the conference is designed for interested parties from college and high school science, engineering and technology programs.

Dr. Paul Aebersold, director, Office of Isotopes Development, Atomic Energy Commission, and Dr. Ralph Overman, chairman, Special Training Division, Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies, will address the session.

Dr. Aebersold will speak on the "Four R's of Atomic Energy" and Dr. Overman's address will be on "The Fundamentals of Radioactivity." The last hour of the session will be devoted to questions from the audience.

The division of physical sciences, El Camino college, is sponsoring this conference in cooperation with the Office of Isotopes Development, United States Atomic Energy Commission; Northrop Corporation; and Western Gear Corporation.

Contemporary students and instructors must become more familiar with the nuclear sciences because, as greater amounts of information and special radiological material become available, the use of radiation and radioactive material increases proportionately. In recognition of the need, we have arranged this conference.

Seventh Graders Study Human vs. Animal Traits

What makes man smarter than the other animals? Members of Cecil Paschall's seventh grade class at Madrona Elementary School can answer that question and others about human physiology as the result of recent science studies.

The youngsters dissected a sheep's head, comparing the size of the brain and its parts with those in a human. They discovered that the main difference was in the cerebrum, which controls man's thought processes. They also studied development of the sheep's nervous system.

Paschall spent two summers studying under National Science Foundation Scholarships at DePauw University, Ind., and at St. Cloud, Minn., College. Awards are made to top teachers for further study in science.
