

"Dear Hunt" Important, Baptist Pastor States

Pastor, Robert A. Wells, of the Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church of Lomita, will begin a morning and evening series of sermons on this Sunday. The morning sermons will be delivered at the 8:30 and 10:50 services on the "Great Events From The Life of Christ." This series of ten sermons will come to a grand climax on Easter Sunday. The first will be on "Temptations." "Based on the temptations of Jesus, it will bring to bear the relation to our own temptations," Mr. Wells stated.

Series of four sermons at the 7:30 p.m. services will be on "Love, Marriage and the Home." The first in this series will be of interest to the young at heart. The subject will be "The Dear Hunt." "One of the big yet early events in the life of all is finding a mate. Preparation for this 'dear hunt' is more important than most parents have realized," the pastor will state.

The church voted to accept a loan proposal that will make possible the construction of an educational building that will care for more than 300 people. It will also provide for the church offices. Over 8,000 feet of floor space will be built.


