

How a school district keeps its fingers on its own pulse will be the topic of discussion at the Torrance Educational Advisory Committee meeting next Monday, Feb. 6, at the Torrance Masonic Hall.

Led by Assistant Superintendent Albert N. Posner, a panel will discuss "How Does a School District Evaluate Itself?" Other participants will include Superintendent J. H. Hull; Martin Beaudet, principal of Casimir Elementary School; and Mrs. Mary Starrett, seventh grade teacher at Casimir.

Musical selections will be provided by the South High School Instrumental Ensemble, directed by Glenn Hawley. Assistant Superintendent S. E. Waldrip will present a school construction report.

Lutheran Day School Opens

Another step in the fulfillment of the long range education program of Ascension Lutheran Church, Torrance, will be taken Monday, Feb. 6, when six kindergarten pupils and Mrs. Paul Kasten, their teacher, move into their classroom in the new education building.

Built at a cost of \$40,000, the modern brick building will supply badly needed facilities for Sunday school classrooms, youth groups and organizational meetings. Consisting of three large classrooms, the building will accommodate about 100 students on a day school basis.

Christian Day School was started in September, 1960, with a kindergarten class of seven students. Classes were held in the parish hall of the church while awaiting completion of the present facilities.
