NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in the matter of County Improvement No. 2156-M (Berendo Avenue) that sealed bids or proposals will be received up to 9:00 a.m. on the 21st day of February, 1961, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, at its office at 383 Hall of Administration, 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles 12, California, for the purchase of bonds to be issued in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Improvement Act (Municipal Improvement Act of 1913), and Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code, for the reimbursement and for the construction of sanitary sewers under the provisions of the Municipal Improvement Act of 1913.

George Powell Guest Speaker For Realtors

"Better Community Relations for 1961" was the topic of a talk given by George Powell, planning director for the city of Torrance at the monthly meeting last week of the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors at the Jump 'N Jack restaurant.

Planning director Powell told of the transition of the city of Torrance from the old Rancho San Pedro to the present San Fe. He pointed out the boundaries of the Rancho granted to Dominguez in 1884. The area that was covered at that time is now Redondo Beach, Compton, Wilmington Sepulveda, Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills and Torrance.

Continuing with the history of the area Powell told of how in 1900 the territory was divided into ranches owned by families whose names are well known in Torrance today. They are the Carson, Better, Narbonne, Kettler, Jaughin, Weston, Ellenwood and Quandt families.

Ground breaking for the city of Torrance was in 1912. From 1926 until 1959 annexations continued until Torrance became the city it is today.

Concluding his interesting talk, Powell stated that there was "no reason why Torrance should not be a city of 150,000 by 1965."

Reports on the convention were given by Lee Dawson, Alvin Grancell and Gerald Alter. John A. Bramhill, senior administrator assistant of the city of Torrance was also an honored guest.
