
Evening High School Offers Varied Curricula in 1961

Beginning on Wednesday, February 8, the Torrance Adult Education second semester program will include a Business Law course, to be taught by Fred N. Benson. For the past two years, Benson has been the Deputy District Attorney, assigned to the South Bay area. Recently, however, he has entered private practice in the position vacated by Judge William E. McFaden. His offices are in Redondo Beach and he is associated with James Hall.

Benson is an instructor in both Business and Law courses, having received his master's degree in business administration and law degree from the University of Michigan. He received his bachelor's degree in political science from Earlham College in Richmond, Indiana.

Business Law course will meet on Wednesday evenings, starting at 7 p.m., in Room J-1, at South High School. The course will include contracts, agency, insurance, wills, criminal liability, bills and notes, property, tax, and other areas of law which are a part of a family's everyday contacts.
