Bridge tip of the week: Regarding contracts in a minor suit; usually, a long minor suit in one hand is the tip-off that the contract should be played at no trumps. This long six or seven card suit will take just as many tricks at no trumps as it will in a minor suit.

If your hand contains a singleton and a void it should not be played at no trump and the better players will try for six in a minor rather than just game.
