Harbor Students to Tour Annual Career Day Meet

Six Harbor College students will take a direct and effective approach toward a choice of vocation when they attend the third annual career day, sponsored by the California Probation, Parole, and Correctional Association on March 8 at Norwalk.

Mike Borda, Carolyn Curry, Shirley Jones, John La Valle, Rosemary Storti, and Bob Stuart, accompanied by sociology professors Ellen Erchul and Myron Erickson, will represent Harbor at the all-day symposium. Alternates are Bill Berry, Marg Karow, Sharon Klein, Mary Scheffler, and Leonard Teerlink.

The local delegates will be joined by 300 other students and faculty members from 40 junior colleges, colleges, and universities to hear top experts in the correctional field describe the growing opportunities in that profession and answer questions regarding qualifications and training.

Panel speakers will be Karl Holton, chief probation officer of Los Angeles County; Richard McGee, director of the California State Department of Corrections; and Tomam Start, director of the California Youth Authority. All three panelists will discuss delinquency prevention.

A tour of the California Reception Center-Clinic will close the morning session and will be followed by lunch at the swimming pool. Students will then separate into discussion groups conducted by professional leaders in each phase of correctional work.

Personal conferences will be arranged for interested students with representatives of the various functions in the correctional field. An evaluation period, including a summation by Dr. Woodrow Scott, professor of sociology at George Pepperdine College, will close the career day symposium.
