Numbers to be played by the Youth Band include the Nabucco overture by Verdi, An Occasional Suite by Handel, A Childhood Fantasy by Liliya, the "Cortège" from Mlada by Rimsky-Korsakov, the overture from El Seraglio by Mozart, and the Slavonic Rhapsody No. 2 by Friedemann.

Tickets for the concert are being sold by the members of the Youth Band and by members of the Junior Youth Band. Tickets may also be obtained at the box office just prior to the concert.
