Eight Trophies Collected By El Camino Journalism Students at San Diego Meet

El Camino College journalism students are displaying eight additions to their trophy collection this week, following sessions of the Journalism Association of Junior Colleges which netted them the lion's share of presentations.

In competition with representatives of 31 other junior colleges from all parts of California, the ECC writers and photographers took four of ten first places, one second and three third place trophies.

Top awards were won by Ken Huthmaker of Hawthorne, who took first place in news photography, and Ken Whitney of Torrance, whose yearbook photo also won him a first-place trophy. Mrs. Lois Hawsley of WALTERIA received a third-place award for an entry in the yearbook division of photography.

Jim Isadore of Hawthorne received a third-place trophy for superiority in column writing.

In similar competition in the news field, Wayne Overbeck of Manhattan Beach took third place in news writing; he was also given second place in feature writing, the award being made for a pre-convention story printed in the Warwhoop.

Most Accidents Happen During Clear Weather

Despite the dangers posed by such driving hazards as rain, fog, darkness and adverse roadway conditions, upwards of two-thirds of all fatal and injury accidents in California last year occurred during clear weather, on straight, level roads.

More than one-half of all injury accidents occurred in daylight hours. This figure was reversed for fatal accidents, with approximately two-thirds occurring at night.

California Highway Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden pointed out that the "figures support our often-expressed belief that drivers, not conditions, cause most accidents."

"Last year 3723 persons were killed and 154,760 were injured in highway accidents. Some of these deaths and injuries were attributable to poor visibility, road or weather conditions. Many, many more were attributed to driver error—lapses in awareness or violations of the law."

"Again I emphasize the necessity for mature driving—alertness, courtesy, and a realization that mistakes bring severe penalties, injury or death."
