The 16th annual Los Angeles Sportsmen's and Vacation Show, a \$10 million display of outdoor fun and recreation equipment, opens April 6 at Pan-Pacific Auditorium, in Hollywood, for a 10 day run.

As you know, the show is the largest and one of the oldest exhibits in the country. Promoted by H. Werner Buck, the extravaganza is studded with entertainment goodies this year. Boats, camping equipment, camper trucks, guns, fishing tackle, sporting goods on display, are valued at more than \$10 million.

You ought to take in tackle row Mike. It's an incredible assortment of fishing gear...gadgets to satisfy the wildest dreams of dedicated fishermen, from dry flies to huge compound deepsea reels, and much bric-a-brac.

Knowing you to be a traveler, you must see the special exhibits prepared by resort areas from most of the Western States, Canada, and Mexico. Vacation counselors will be on hand to help you plan that next trip of yours.

Buck, executive producer of the outdoor show, has gathered an unusual assemblage of sports champions for the Parade of Outdoor Champions, featured stage and pool entertainment which will be presented twice daily at 4 p.m. and 8 p.m., with an additional matinee performance at 2 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays. John Bromfield, TV's star of "U.S. Marshall," will be on hand to act as master of ceremonies.

LOG ROLLING EXHIBIT UNUSUAL. In our many get-togethers you talked of a trip you made into the Pacific Northwest. Of the logging that fascinated you and your family. Well, in our show, we have an exhibit that will remind you of the time you spent watching loggers. Diane Ellison, 19-year-old University of Washington sophomore lovely, will give an exhibition of log rolling, the hairy pastime of that part of our country. Miss Ellison won the ladies' national logrolling title at the Albany, Ore. Timber carnival last summer. At the Pan Pacific she does handstands, skips rope and performs other acrobatics on this unstable platform.

Admission to all this, plus lots more, is only \$1.50 for adults and 75 cents for children under 12. Families in the South Bay and Torrance should make it a must. Many exhibitors will post valuable door prizes and skill prizes for show visitors, including boats, tackle and other outdoor sports equipment.

## El Camino to Host Stars of Conferences

El Camino College cindermen will compete in the Cerritos Relays to be held at Cerritos College at 10 a.m. this morning.

Western Conference track teams will classify the entries. The Eastern Conference would have had the strongest contenders, but due to conflict in schedule they were forced to drop out. The Western and Metropolitan Conferences hold the potential, with the Western Conference teams slightly dominating.

El Camino College, member of the Metro-Conference, will have its hands full in competing with the strongly favored-to-win Long Beach and Valley track teams. Bakersfield won the relays last year.

## Kluszewski, Rice Named to Staff Baseball School

Ted Kluszewski, Del Rice and Albie Pearson of the Los Angeles Angels were named Tuesday to the coaching staff of Leo Durocher's California Baseball School, which opens Saturday morning, April 15.

Additional Angel players will be selected, according to Danny Dare, vice president of the school, who is handling enrollments at 490 South San Vicente, Los Angeles 48, OL 3-6930.

Angel players will take over classes on the third week of the school, April 29, alternating with a staff of Dodger stars who will serve under Durocher for the first two sessions.

Classes for the eight-week course will be held at several locations, including Sherman Oaks, Gardena, Downey, West Los Angeles, Pomona and Rosemead, among others.

Kluszewski is a power-hitting first baseman with more than a decade of experience in both the National and American leagues. Rice is a veteran catcher and coach in both leagues. Pearson, a Southern Californian, is a former rookie of the year as an outfielder.

Durocher earlier announced that Dodgers Don Drysdale, Duke Snider, Larry Sherry, Charlie Neal, Johnny Podres and Tommy Davis would conduct initial classes on April 15 from 10 a.m. to noon.

All field events plus the 440 yd. relay, 880 yd. relay, two mile relay, distance medley relay, mile relay, and shuttle hurdles will complete the list of events in the tri-conference championships.

Coach Ray Southstone of ECC says, "The two mile relay and the discuss will be our strongest events." This year El Camino cindermen could place high in the conference.

Morningside tallied three runs on an error and five walks in the third inning. North crept up to 3-2 only to see Morningside go ahead 6-2.



Dennis Hogue got the Saxons out of trouble in the second and sixth innings. Unfortunately for North he was limited to two innings by league rule, as he pitched a seven inning shut out only two days before. Pitchers Bill Kehoe and Bill Shenkel were ineffective as they both had control problems.

**JV INNINGS**

## Outstanding Track Stars Accept Bids for MSA's April 28 Relays

Ernie Cunliffe, Cliff Cushman, Eddie Southern and Rex Cawley head an outstanding group of track athletes who already have accepted invitations to compete in the Third Annual Mt. San Antonio Relays, April 28-29.

Olympian Cunliffe, Stanford graduate student who is fresh from a great indoor season that included a 2:07.9 record in the 1000-yard run, has geared his schedule to break Tom Courtney's 1:46.8 880-yard world record.

Relays Director Hilmer Lodge is lining up an international field to face Cunliffe on the lighting-fact Mt. San Antonio brick-clay track, where the U.S. Olympic team broke four world marks and tied another last summer in the greatest one-day meet ever.

**400-METER HURDLES**  
Cushman, former Kansas star, will go in the 400-meter hurdles as will Southern of the Air Force and SC's Cawley. Cushman was runnerup at 46.6 to now retired Glenn Davis at Rome in the Olympic finals. Southern was second to Davis at Melbourne in '56, was Olympic alternate in 1960 at 49.9 and holds the Mt. Sac stadium record of 51.0. Early NCAA favorite Cawley ran 50.6 as a Trobabe in 1960, and is defending Relays champion.

Along with the half-mile and 400-meter hurdles, other Mt. San Antonio invitational events include a featured mile, 440-yard dash, 100-yard dash,

in the tying and winning runs with a key single.

Jon Beck's steady pitching was a major factor. Wilson earlier hit a triple. All five of the JV wins have been come from behind performances.
