Huckleberry Hound was created as a children's TV serial, but the wry philosophy of the canine with the Carolina drawl caught on with adult viewers and became a smash.

Later, the droll dog's pal, Yogi Bear, became an outstanding TV "personality," and the Hanna-Barbera team split the act, and Yogi now stars in a TV show of his own.

However, it sometimes becomes mandatory to eat out. Either to please the Betty Crocker you have at home or to just get away, if only for several meals a year, from her horribly prepared morsels.

Right away you throw out traveling to 'Frisco. Airline fares haven't gone down that much. Your tummy is empty and you realize that an hour is too long to wait. Therefore you reach for your newspaper restaurant guide to assist you in picking the spot. The ads are appetizing but newsprint is not very delicious you've been told. So the selection is difficult, however, somehow you make up your mind and with us it was the Pen and Quill eatery on Sepulveda Blvd. in Manhattan Beach.

BOB REUBEN HOSTS
As Lennie Reuben, the maître D, sits you in a comfortable booth or table, you cannot help but notice the decor... a mounted Pen quill, framed letters, photographs and articles adorning the many room Pen & Quill.

The menu is handed to you and on one side of the enormous parchment you read, "Some notes about Pen & Quill and your host."

Suddenly it hits you! "Your host" is Bob Reuben, former famed foreign correspondent. The notes tell you that Bob worked for Reuters, NBC, United Press. That he covered President Roosevelt during his tenure in the White House; his interviews include Truman, Winston Churchill, General and Madame Chang Kai-Shek, Generals MacArthur, Eisenhower, De Gaulle, and many others. As you read further you are informed that Reuben was the first correspondent to land in Normandy during the allied invasion in 1944; that he reported the Japanese surrender from the decks of the U.S.S.
