Rosey Gilhausen started his professional career in baseball with the St. Louis Cardinals in 1931. Later he

doubled as a player and manager of the Tallasee club in the Alabama - Florida League and in 1940 he hit .335 as the club won the pennant and the playoffs.

Gilhausen began scouting in 1945 with Hollywood. He joined the Brooklyn Dodger organization in 1948 and switched to Pittsburgh in 1951 working under General Manager Haney from 1949 to 1955 when the latter managed at Hollywood and Pittsburgh.

New president of the Southern California Hot Stove League, Gilhausen has signed a number of present and past major leaguers such as Lee Walls, Bennie Daniels, Ellis Burton and Norm Sherry.


