Bridge Instruction Course Launched

Are you familiar with Jump Shift, Jump No Trump Take-out, Reverse, Two Over One Suit Take-out and Forcing Bids? Are you familiar with these terms? If not, then you need bridge lessons. A new exciting eight week course in bridge is being offered by the Torrance YWCA on Thursday, afternoon from 12:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Bob Christie, the director of the Torrance Bridge Club, the San Pedro Bridge Club and Gardena Bridge Club, will instruct those people who are interested in learning bridge or improving their game. He states the course is designed for one hour of lesson and one hour of supervised play.

Lesson 1 — Opening Bids, Evaluating your hand, and which suit to open.

Lesson 2 — Raising your partner's suit and reevaluating your hand after a raise.

Lesson 3 — Bidding a new suit, no trump take-out, jump shift, and reverse.

Lesson 4 — Defensive bids, over-calling at the one level, and at the two level, no trump over-all.

Lesson 5 — Defensive bids, jump-over-calls, penalty doubles, and take-out doubles for your partner to bid a suit.

Lesson 6 — Rebids by the opener to show strength or weakness, and legal signals, (ear-pulling isn't legal).

Lesson 7 — No-Trump bidding, with a square or balanced hand, or with an unbalanced or uneven hand.

Lesson 8 — Slam bidding, the bids that lead to slams, asking for aces and kings, when not to bid a slam.
