Met Conference Gymnasts Clash At El Camino

Upper and lower echelons of Metropolitan Gymnastics standings collided in the men's gymnasium of El Camino College last night, when the cellar-dwelling Warriors sought their first win of the season against the first-place Harbor Seahawks.

El Camino, always hampered by a light turn-out of experienced gymnasts, has dropped its three conference tiffs, while Harbor has swept the trio of events in which it has participated.

In its outing last week, the Warrior contingent dropped a close decision, when Valley College slid past Coach Don Jurk's squad by a narrow 76-68 margin in the El Camino Gym.

OUTSTANDING

Probably the most outstanding performance of the meet was Warrior Gene Shelton's victory on the rings. Shelton averaged nine points of a possible ten on each routine in his winning effort.

Despite El Camino's loss, Coach Jurk said, "Doug Campbell, Don Dewey and Gene Shelton all came through with excellent performances in a losing cause."

Don Murphy (ECC) grabbed off two seconds and a third which gave him third spot in the all-around standings. Murphy placed second in free exercise and horizontal bars, while taking third in the side horse.



Outstanding Horse Show Slated June 3-4; Cerebral Palsy Benefit

One of the Southland's outstanding events will be the Las Angelinas Intimate Horse Show to be staged at Devon-

shire Downs, 18000 Devonshire Street, Northridge on Saturday, June 3 and Sunday, June 4. Proceeds of the event, which is authorized by the American Horse Show Association, will go to the Cerebral Palsy Unit of the Orthopaedic Hospital.

Featuring the top saddle-bred mounts and the leading horsemen of the West, there will be two shows each day, beginning at 9 a.m. and 2 p.m.

With the AHSA affiliation, all events will be run off under Association rules and the points in all competition will be tabulated for the national championship ratings. The Las Angelinas Show will also be recorded with the Pacific

Coast Hunter, Jumper and Stock Horse Association for the eventual naming of the Pacific Coast championships. The theme of the show is "Meet the Horses."

Manager of the event is Frank Jordano, Jr., Santa Barbara, who has directed many of the leading horse shows in the western area, including the Las Vegas National Horse Show. In addition to his show management during the past eight years, he has been a horse owner and enthusiast all of his life. He has raised and exhibited horses for many years, also being affiliated with the national and Pacific Coast horse show associations.

CHUCK WAGON

Following each day's events, the activity will be climaxed with a chuck wagon dinner, beginning at 6 p.m. Refreshments and light lunches will be available on the premises throughout all performances.

A highlight of the two-day affair will be the crowning of the Queen of the Las Angelinas Horse Show. Her Majesty, attended by two princesses, will be crowned by some dignitary of the equestrian or entertainment world. Selection of the Queen is now under way.

Las Angelinas, Inc., made up of women dedicated to service and child welfare, has

made many contributions to the Cerebral Palsy Unit of the Los Angeles Orthopaedic Hospital during the past fourteen years, including the conversion of the Singleton Estate at Flower and Adams Streets in Los Angeles to an educational center for cerebral palsied children. Operating under the creed "Wings for Spastic Children," the organization has undertaken the staging of the event at Devonshire Downs to raise funds for furtherance of several phases of the project.
