Surgery Professor Lectures Luncheon Meeting of MD's

Dr. Ian McDonald, clinical professor of surgery at the University of Southern California Medical School, states that skin cancer in Southern California is eight times more common than in Illinois. He made this statement recently while speaking to 100 staff doctors of Torrance Memorial Hospital at Palms restaurant. Dr. McDonald's topic was "Newer Concepts of Cancer, Etiology, and Treatment."

Sun radiation was said to be the big factor in causing much more skin cancer in this area than in Illinois.

Dr. McDonald, who is also secretary of the Los Angeles County Medical Association, declared that the red-headed person is more apt to get skin cancer than other people.

"I know of no case of cancer of the breast that has developed following the removal of a non-malignant breast lump," said the speaker.

While he has investigated many cases of injury, Dr. McDonald has been unable to find a single case of cancer due to the injury.

"Inheritance is a factor in cancer development," he declared. He believes that heavy smoking is not nearly as important in the development of lung cancer as many other investigators maintain.

Dr. Robert F. Nielsen, program chairman, introduced Dr. MacDonald. Dr. John F. Nursall, hospital chief of staff, presided at the meeting. The speaker taught Dr. Nielsen, Dr. Nursall, and many of the other physicians in attendance when they were medical students at USC.

Scholarships Established

Two new scholarships for high school students who plan to enroll in two-year technical programs at Los Angeles Trade-Technical College in September have been established by the John Stauffer Foundation, it was announced by F. Parker Wilber, college president.

Very Young, Older In Most Accidents

The very young and the older person are most susceptible to pedestrian accidents, California Highway Patrol statistics for 1960 indicate. A total of 286 persons, or

37 per cent of the 764 pedestrians who met death in traffic accidents last year, were 65 years and older. One-fifth of the deaths, or 145, were youngsters under 10 years

"These figures hold significance for both motorists and pedestrians," pointed out Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden. "The driver should be alert for the child who may unexpectedly appear in the street. The danger is particularly high in school zones and residential districts. The motorists also must maintain vigilance for the older person, who may take a few extra seconds in crossing. "For the pedestrian, the watchword should be "caution."
