### Annual Spring Book Affair Planned by County Librarians

Curtain goes up on the wonderful world of children's literature May 10 at the Statler Hilton, downtown, Los Angeles, when the County Library unveils its 19th annual Spring Book Breakfast.

Miss Betty Lee Addison, branch librarian of the Torrance library, at 1345 Post Avenue and members of the staff, will join with an expected 600 and more other ardent supporters of children's books in saluting nine of the Southland's leading authors and illustrators who will be the honor guests and speakers at the affair.

County Librarian John D. Henderson and Mrs. Mary Rogers Smith, breakfast chairman, are presenting four of the year's literary award winners, a new writer-illustrator team, an author who specializes in stories for the pre-school child and articles on children's books for adult consumption, the area's only winner of the Caldecott Award, and a faculty member of the School of Library Science, USC, who will deliver the key-note address.

The four current award winners are Scott O'Dell, who received the Newbery Medal (most distinguished writing) for his "Island of the Blue

Dolphins," Mrs. Shirley Lease Arora, winner of the Charles W. Follett Prize (best theme) for her first book, "What Then, Raman?," and Bob and Jan Young, husband and wife writing team, whose last two novels for teen-agers, "One Small Voice" and "Saddles for Breakfast," both published this year, were Junior Literary Guild selections.

Edmund Lindop, high school history teacher, and Mrs. Jane Carlson, well-known mural painter, a new writer-illustrator team, are other speakers. Their book is "Jumbo, King of the Elephants."

Mrs. Myra Berry Brown is the author who writes for the pre-school child and for adults. Her latest book is "Daddy's Visiting Our School Today."

Leo Politi is the traditional Breakfast guest. He won the Caldecott Award (best illustrations) eleven years "Moy Moy," a story of China-ago. He recently published a child's story about Mexico and working on text and art of a story about Medieval Italy.

"Writing for young minds, a challenge and a vision," is the Breakfast theme.
