Monday—Oven fried chicken, savory baked rice, chilled tomato cup, celery sticks, peach, half, bread, butter, milk.

Tuesday—Chopped beef on whipped potatoes, citrus fruit salad, pumpkin custard, bread, butter, milk.

Wednesday—Breaded veal cutlets, creamed potatoes, confetti salad, applesauce cup and peanut butter confection, bread, butter, milk.

Thursday—Baked beans and wieners, buttered parsley carrots, apple and celery salad, orange juice bar, hot cornbread, milk.
