"Mr. Torrance," Sam Levy, for the fourth time has been named local chairman of the "Hope Sunday" drive on June 4 for the City of Hope.

In accepting as chairman, Levy said volunteer "Citizens of Hope" are being sought for the one-day, door-to-door campaign for funds to help support the free, non-sectarian medical center's pilot program against catastrophic diseases.

"Hope Sunday donations," he said, "will help provide absolutely free care for patients suffering from cancer, the leukemias, blood, chest, operable heart conditions and hereditary afflictions."

In addition, he said, the pilot medical facility is devoting its efforts to development of new advances in patient care and research.

He pointed out that scores of residents from this community have received countless days of both in-patient and outpatient care at City of Hope.

Voted 1958 "Man of the Year" in Torrance, Levy is well known in philanthropic and civic circles here. He urged residents to "respond from the heart" when called upon to participate in the humanitarian "Hope Sunday" march on June 4.

Phone Company Lists Torrance Expenditures

Western Electric Company, the Bell System's manufacturing and supply unit, purchased supplies amounting to nearly \$130,000 from 12 business firms in Torrance during 1960, Pacific Telephone said in figures released this week.

In total, the company paid out nearly \$167 million in California in 1960 for supplies and services, gross payrolls and major new construction.

This breaks down to about \$457,000 a day and represents 8 per cent of the \$2 billion Western Electric spent last year in all of the 50 states and 15 foreign countries.
