Former Nativity pastor, Msgr. Thomas J. McCarthy, has been named pastor of a newly-formed Palos Verdes-Rolling Hills parish.

Father Cremins, born in Los Angeles and one of three priest brothers, was ordained April 22, 1942. He is a former archdiocesan director of music.

The son of Eugene and Katharine Cremins, natives of County Cork, Ireland, Father Cremins received his education at Holy Cross School and the archdiocesan junior seminary.

He began his studies at the major seminary in Menlo Park in 1936, transferring later to St. John's Seminary, Camarillo, to complete his studies for ordination.

### Alcohol Problems Discussed by Rev. Birdsall

The Reverend Bergen Birdsall, executive director of the California Council on Alcohol Problems, an agency through which the Christian forces of our state carry on a united

temperance ministry, will be the guest speaker at the Torrance Foursquare Church, corner of Arlington and Sepulveda Blvd., Sunday evening at 7:15 p.m., May 21.

Mr. Birdsall began his work with the Council in 1947 from the U.S. Air Force where he served as a chaplain (major) with overseas duty in the South Pacific during World War II. In 1948 he became a Fellow of the Yale School of Alcohol Studies. He has spoken to hundreds of thousands of young people in the United States, including Hawaii, and in fifteen foreign countries.

Mr. Birdsall is a Board Member of the Institute of Scientific Studies for the Prevention of Alcoholism and of the

National Temperance League Executive Committee and Committee on Education.

Over 20,000 copies of his book "Teaching Unit on Alcohol Education" have been sold in seventeen states.

The Council's program on Alcohol-Narcotic Education is widely recognized by educational and civic leaders as a much needed service to youth. Its lecture presentation and "Teaching Unit" reached thousands of young people in the public schools of California during the past school year.
