

New 'Three Lions' Opens

One hundred years of family experience in serving and satisfying gourmets in outstanding dining spots of the nation is the background for the new Three Lions Restaurant, recently opened in Redondo Beach.

Located at Redondo Beach Blvd. and Hawthorne Blvd., directly opposite the South Bay Center, the \$750,000 establishment is owned and operated by Russell, George and James Alotis, all of whom have had wide experience as second-generation restaurateurs.

Ground-breaking for the Three Lions took place in August of last year, and the rambling functional contemporary structure contains a main dining room, Pit Room and cocktail lounge, in addition to an 85-seat coffee shop

which is open on a 25-hour basis.

Russ Alotis is the eldest of the three brothers, who owned and operated restaurants in Detroit, Mich., before they moved to Los Angeles in 1950, where they became associated with the Beverly Hills and Ambassador Hotels, Perino's and the Brown Derby.

In 1958 they opened their Chef's Restaurants in Alhambra, Glendale and two in Los Angeles, and several years later decided on the north Redondo Beach site as the location for their major quality house operation.

Russ Alotis serves as administrator, George handles the physical plant and Jim is involved in all management demands. Their father, now-retired Milton Alotis, assists in an advisory capacity.

Glenn Arbogast Jr. was the architect for the ultramodern building, which features such novel treatments as a series of illuminated interior and exterior masts, flying stairways and suspended canopies.

The wide varied menu lists luncheons at \$1.50, and dinners begin at \$2.75, with special budget items for children under the age of 12.

All three brothers have purchased residential property in Palos Verdes Estates.

Legislators and state government agencies throughout the West are probably better informed about "mobile living" than the populace at large.

The reason: lawmakers in Oregon, Washington, Texas, Idaho, and California have long recognized the need for laws and regulations covering a category of society that numbers more than three million persons in just the states named.

Significantly, the laws enacted, have, year by year, reflected the growing recognition of a new way of life and the increasing public responsibility exhibited by what was a new industry as recently as 10 years ago.

This industry, through organizations like Trailer Coach Association, has adopted a policy of self-policing—working with state divisions of housing, highways, and sanitation to draw up standards for plumbing, heating, wiring and other trailer features that affect on-the-road and trailer park safety.

A California law now in effect on construction standards is almost certain to be duplicated in principle by other western states. It raises and standardizes specifications for fittings, piping, wiring and electrical materials in trailers.
