Local Horsemen to Have Part in Sheriff's Rodeo

Richard "Paladin" Boone, adventurous champion of justice in the Old West in his popular TV series, "Have Gun, Will Travel," will undertake a new role on June 24—grand marshal of the 1961 Sheriff's Rodeo.

Clad in his familiar "Paladin" costume, Boone will ride in a grand entry parade featuring 18 brilliantly attired Sheriff's Poses and scores of the Southland's most picturesque silver mounted riders.

A seventh-generation nephew to his part as grand marshal in the 17th annual version of the classic outdoor event sponsored by the Sheriff's Rodeo Association.

Presented under the direction of Monte Montana, world-famed trick rider and roper, the rodeo will combine nearly 1000 performers and

more than a million dollars' worth of costumes, saddles and horses in the greatest one-day western show on earth.

Heading the vast and colorful aggregation will be Sheriff Peter J. Pitchess and his 67-man Silver Mounted Posse. The dazzling retinue also will include cowboys, stars, trick riders and ropers, clowns, Indian dancers, chuckwagon racers and many others.

The action-packed revival of the lusty days of yore when rugged wranglers staged rodeos just for fun will be a Saturday night event in the Coliseum. With ticket sales running ahead of last year, Monte urges early reservations for choice seats.

Ticket sites are the coliseum, Los Angeles Sheriff's office, all sheriff's stations and county marshal's offices.

Construction on County's Largest Ice Skating Rink to Start Soon

Los Angeles County's largest public ice skating rink—ice housed in a 32,000-square-foot building—soon is to be constructed in the Lomita area of South Bay.

It will be named the "Olympic Ice Arena," according to Ian Pinkerton, the rink's general manager and spokesman for a group of South Bay area backers.

The rink will encompass the most modern architecture, refrigeration and patron service possible, according to Pinkerton. A contract is expected to be awarded and construction to commence within 30 days. A November completion date is planned.

SKI LODGE MOTIF

Architecture will be of a ski lodge motif, with a tendency toward the modern, according to architect William Wookey and Associates, Playa Del Rey.

A novel, but pleasant, feature of the new ice arena will be a fireplace in an open area near the rink for skaters use, much in the fashion of ski lodge decor and festivity.

A unique spectator attraction will be a restaurant from which diners will view skating rink activity through a massive plate glass window. The restaurant will be a plane higher and separate from the rink. Restaurant tables will face the rink on a tiered arrangement, with entrance to the restaurant from the outside.

Other features of Olympic Ice Arena will be a coffee shop for skater and visitors;

seating capacity for 1500 persons rinkside; a "club room" for skate groups and clubs, complete with its own fireplace, lockers, closets, trophy cases and furnishings; a "togg shop" for skates and skating accessories; plus a shop at which figure, hockey and speed skates will be rented and repaired.

COMPETITIVE SKATERS

"Patch Ice," an arrangement whereby competitive skaters may rent portions of the rink for practice, will be available, Pinkerton said.

Exact location of the ice arena will be on the east side of Western Avenue at its juncture with 288th St. The three-acre plot has an 1100-foot frontage facing west on Western Avenue.

Total cost of the project will be \$500,000, Pinkerton said. Long-range development will include other buildings on the acreage for small stores and shops.

Dimensions of the plot of ice will be 90 by 225 feet, making it the largest in the country and allowing for a total square footage of 20,250. Other facilities in the building will utilize the remainder of the 32,000 square feet.

Instruction will be available for novices, intermediate and advanced skaters, Pinkerton said.

NEW RINK

The scheme and preparation of the new rink has been done with the intention of making ice skating the same pleasant sport and recreation for Southern Californians that it has been for families elsewhere in the country for centuries, Pinkerton said.
