

Four Plays Presented By LAH Junior College

Religious Group Plan Assembly

Preparations are being made by the Torrance Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses to participate in the forthcoming assembly of California Circuit 16 at the Washington High School, 108th and Denker, Los Angeles, said L. E. Olliff, presiding minister, in making the announcement last Sunday. Mr. Olliff stated, "The assembly will be held the weekend of June 23-25 and the Witnesses from the 18 local congregations making up Circuit 16 will be in attendance at all sessions. "The Twentieth Century in Bible Prophecy" is the main discourse and will be given by Theodore Jaracz, District Supervisor of Jehovah's Witnesses, on Sunday, June 25 at 3 p.m.

"Many in our congregation will be on hand Friday evening, June 23 at 6:45 p.m. for the model ministry school," said Olliff. "This will take the place of the regularly scheduled school held that particular week only. Immediately following the school, talks and demonstrations of the ministerial life of modern day Jehovah's Witnesses will be given."

Mr. Olliff further stated, "Water baptism symbolizing the dedication of new ministers to do God's will is always an enjoyable part of any assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses. The baptismal talk will be given at 1 p.m. Saturday, June 24 and all of the ministers who are candidates will be baptized at a local immersion site."

"The revealing of the cause of our current world crisis will be Sunday at 2 p.m., June 25," said Olliff. "When Mr. Jaracz gives the talk 'The Twentieth Century in Bible Prophecy.' This scriptural discussion of prophecy concerning our space age and the comparison of secular history with these prophecies will enable one to believe as Jesus said at John 14:29. Confidence in God's written Word, the Bible, will be vindicated and assurance will be given that God's will is to be done in earth as it is in heaven."

All four plays are the works of well known contemporary playwrights. Albee and Saroyan are Americans, Beckett and Irishman who makes his home in Paris, and Chekov, a Russian.

Casts for the plays include Eugene Dynarski, Michael Aguillar, Frances Hulshof, Tom Bettis, Ron Galzavy, and Lita Potter.

Seats are \$1 and space is limited. High school students May 25 and June 1 performance obtain tickets for the dances for 25 cents.



EC Carpentry Class Builds 'Home Work'

One hour of lecture and two hours of "home" work is the daily schedule for Ken Dutro's carpentry class at El Camino College.

"Home" work is a two bedroom, one-bath, wood frame house which 13 students are constructing in an area adjacent to the college carpentry shop.

The new structure is being erected in the shadow of a completed house, which was sold at public auction.

Dutro's crew has been working on the new house for almost a year. It is the fifth house of this type to be constructed and will be completed by June, 1962.

Different "This one is a little different from the last house" Dutro said. It will have vinyl floors, an all-ash kitchen, and

"The next house to be built will be drastically different from the previous ones," Dutro revealed. The art class is designing it now. Besides having three bedrooms and one and one-half baths, the house will be an example of modern architecture," he continued.

"The house itself is a more excellent device for learning by doing, than by lecture. However, lectures are correlated with the actual construction so that the students will understand the theories behind building.

Dutro, who has been in the trade for 20 years, has worked as a foreman, superintendent, and contractor for various firms. He has been at El Camino for two years.
