Woman to Tell Horrors of Atom Bomb at Services

One August Day in 1945, 15-year-old Yoshiko Taguchi was at her desk in a mission school in Hiroshima, Japan, when a white luminous flash attracted her attention and a fraction of a second later she felt herself spinning through the air like a projectile for 50 feet toward the end of the room.

The walls of the building collapsed, burying her in a pile of broken glass, plaster, wood and twisted steel. Blood poured from her mouth and from 159 wounds on her body and she received what doctors later said was a deadly dose of radiation. Yoshiko is the only one of more than 300 persons from her village, working in Hiroshima, who survived the atom blast.

"I pray every day that no one else will ever have to know this suffering," said Yoshiko. "I am so thankful to be alive. No one but God has saved me. I feel I must do something to thank God for saving my life. I will dedicate my life to Him and to humanity. I want to build bridges, bridges of peace and friendship."

Almost unbelievable account of her struggle to return to her village and the weeks of intense suffering when she lay hovering between life and death, which seem almost like a nightmare to her now, is the experience she will relate to the congregation at the Torrance Four-square Gospel Church at the corner of Arlington and Sepulveda Blvd. on Sunday night, June 11, 1961, at 7:15 p.m.

Rev. Howard T. Lewis, president of the International Gospel League, will interview Miss Taguchi, and following the interview, she will relate in her own words how God spared her life in this first holocaust. For the past 10 years she has been associated with the Japan Mission of the International Gospel League and at the time is taking Theological studies in the United States in preparation for her return to Japan to continue her missionary ministry.

Miss Taguchi has made personal appearances in many churches, colleges, Youth for Christ, Rotary Clubs, missionary conventions, business and professional organizations, radio and TV.


