Have you ever looked at a picture of an Air Force Officer or at the individual and said to yourself, "I'd sure like to be in his position." There are thousands of young men today who are qualified and "could be in his position," yet they don't realize it. The Air Force recently announced another increase in Officer Training School production for the Fiscal Year 1962. The new OTS production quota now calls for 425

male flying type, 775 male, non-flying, and 100 female officers. The male flying people will be ear-marked for flying school before they enter OTS, and on graduation will learn to fly. Then non-rated graduates serve mainly in such field as communications, electronics, electrical & aeronautical engineering, guided missiles, statistics and intelligence.

The qualifications for OTS are really simple — (1) must have a college degree, BS-BA; (2) must be in good physical condition; (3) make application prior to 27th birthday; (4) Females must be single; no restrictions for males.
