New Lockers to Be Used at Pool

Swimmers at the Victor E. Benstead Plunge this summer will notice a change in checking personal belongings.

Coin operated lockers, of the type often seen in transportation terminals have been installed for the convenience of the swimmers.

Instead of handing clothes over to an attendant, patrons will have their own personal locker and key. Service will be quicker and more efficient with no more waiting in line for the attendant. Safer storage of valuables will also provide for greater peace of mind.

STARTS SATURDAY
This service will be inaugurated Saturday, June 17 at a cost of 10 cents per locker. Children and families may double up and thus reduce the expense of locker checking. Admission charges remain the same: 20 cents for children, 25 cents for youth and adults. Those who come prepared to swim without towels, clothing and/or valuables to store need not use the lockers.

Recreation officials explained that the system was installed not only for the convenience and safety of the patrons, but also to reduce and offset increased costs of operating the plunge. This new system eliminates the need for any increase in admission charges.
