Over One Hundred Automobiles, Drivers Entered in Gardena's Racing Special

Over one hundred cars and drivers are entered for Sunday's CJA Hot Rod and Stock Car doubleheader racing program at Gardena's Western Speedway where they will race in the days ten event program capped by two big 30 lap features.

has won five big main events this year, and has moved into second in points, and could pull another win out of the bag Sunday afternoon at 2:30 when the first race begins. Time trials are set for 1 p.m.

Scranton, runner-up last time out, guns his Oldsmobile as he looks for his second win of the year. Plotts, who moved his Ford around Scranton to win last time, also will be looking for his second triumph of the year.

LA Will Purchase Harbor City Land For New Park Site

Los Angeles City Recreation and Park Commission Thursday requested the Bureau of Right of Way and Land to finalize the Bureau's negotiated settlement for acquisition of Parcels 8 and 9, Harbor City Park-Playground, which is in the 15th District, represented by Councilman John S. Gibson Jr.

Harbor City Park - Playground's site is being acquired under provisions of the City's recreation and park bond fund and a bond-fund allocation will finance the facility's development.

Parcel 8 is an improved lot 50 feet wide and 118 feet deep on Lomita Boulevard, west of Frampton Avenue, and will be acquired at a cost of \$10,050. Parcel 9 is also improved, is 100 feet wide and 118 feet deep and will be acquired at a cost of \$23,325.

Negotiations are underway for several parcels needed for the park-playground's site and others are in escrow, according to the Recreation and Park Department.
