

Humane Society Seeks Aid for Kitten Surplus

pet owners find that — cute as they are — too many kittens can be a problem. Sometimes good homes cannot be found for every tiny member of a litter.

Your Los Angeles S.P.C.A. and Southern California Humane Society has a solution to this problem, however. The Society is ready and able to

pick up those "surplus" babies and attempt to find good homes for them, or any other unwanted pets.

It is illegal, as well as cruel, to abandon animals to starvation, exposure, or abuse, points out George Crosier, general manager of the Society. Such abandonment generally results in tragedy for the animals... doubly tragic because it is unnecessary. Be kind, Crosier urges, and call the Society, at REpublic 2-0113, to pick up any pets you cannot keep.

The Society also recommends that female cats be spayed — to avoid the kitten problem next year.

Staff Changes Announced By Douglas Aircraft Co.

A change in executive responsibilities affecting the Santa Monica and El Segundo Divisions of the Douglas Aircraft Company, was announced today by President Donald W. Douglas, Jr.

Jesse L. Jones of Palos Verdes, vice president-general manager of the El Segundo Division will become vice president-general manager of the Santa Monica Division, effective August 1, 1961. He will succeed Leo W. Carter who is resigning to accept a special assignment, details of which will be announced at the appropriate time.

James W. Ross of Rolling Hills, assistant to the general manager at El Segundo, will become general manager of the El Segundo Division effective August 1.

Until the effective date of the new appointments, Jones will spend part of his time at Santa Monica with Carter working out essential details attendant to the change over, Douglas said.

Jones, a native of Kansas, joined the Douglas Aircraft Company in 1937, and two years later was named assistant supervisor in the sub-assembly department at the Santa Monica Division.

PROMOTIONS

During World War II further promotions followed rapidly. He was named supervisor on the A-20 assembly line, then general supervisor on the assembly of the C-54.

After the war, Jones became project superintendent on the DC-6 and in 1951 was named superintendent of the Douglas plant at Tulsa, Oklahoma. He later became works manager and in 1957 was named general manager.

He became a Company vice president in October 1958, and in January, 1960, was appointed general manager of the El Segundo Division.


Ross, a native of Illinois, is a graduate of the University of Nebraska in Business Administration. He joined Douglas in 1934 as a drill press operator, and by 1942 had advanced to the position of supervisor of pricing, pricing and release, at the El Segundo Division. In 1943 he was appointed contract administrator at El Segundo and in 1951 was named assistant to the general manager.

Carter, who was born in Missouri was graduated from the University of Washington and obtained this MS degree in Engineering. He joined Douglas in 1930 as an engineering designer.

Other positions he has held include assistant plant manager and engineering manager, "Oklahoma City plant." He was in charge of experimental manufacturing at Santa Monica and later became plant manager. He has been vice president-general manager of the Santa Monica Division since 1951.

Long prominent in the Santa Monica community, Carter is president of the Santa Monica Board of Education, a director of the Community Chest, and a Trustee of the First Presbyterian Church.





Enlistment Program Told

Young men enlisting in the United States Naval Reserve program before the end of June may request four weeks active duty for training this summer, with full pay, transportation, board and room.

They will be sent to San Diego Naval Training Center for two weeks recruit training, and they will then go directly aboard ship for two weeks training afloat. Upon returning to port they will receive Navy pay and be returned home in time to enroll in school this fall; according to Lieutenant Commander A. C. Jackson, USN, Commanding Officer, U.S. Naval Reserve Training Center, Hawthorne, California.

New reservists will be members of Naval Reserve Surface Division 11-22(M), based at Hawthorne, and will be required to attend division drills on Wednesday evenings 7:30 to 10:30 p.m. A full days Navy pay is received for each drill attended.

The summer program permits new trainees to advance to seaman apprentice rate in six (6) months and to qualify for the rate of seaman in 12 months. They will be serving a part of their six year military obligation while going to school. Naval reservists going to college have an opportunity to become commissioned officers and they can have active duty deferred until graduation.
