Water Question Causes Conflict

U. S. Senator Thomas H. Kuchel of California recently urged the Senate Interior Committee to draft legislation which will "remove roadblocks from maximum cooperation" between Federal and State governments in achieving the greatest possible conservation and utilization of the Nation's rivers.

Differences between the two levels of government over control of water rights, particularly in streams purely within a single state, must be settled by Congress, Kuchel declared in attacking "sweeping claims" of the Justice Department that the United States has "overriding" paramount rights" over all unappropriated waters of California and other Western States.
