Ribakoff Earns US Commission With Marines

Alan P. Ribakoff of Torrance was among 30 seniors at the University of Missouri who completed the Naval ROTC program, receiving commissions in the US Navy and US Marine Corps at the 119th annual commencement.

Ribakoff, 4527 Tortugas, received a B. J. degree, and was commissioned an Ensign in the U.S. Navy Reserve. He attended Huntington East High School, Huntington, W. Va.

As a midshipman in the NROTC program, Ribakoff held the rank of ensign. He is a member of Sigma Delta Chi, national professional journalism fraternity, and was student president in the school of journalism.

Four others who completed the platoon leaders course also received commissions. Capt. August A.
